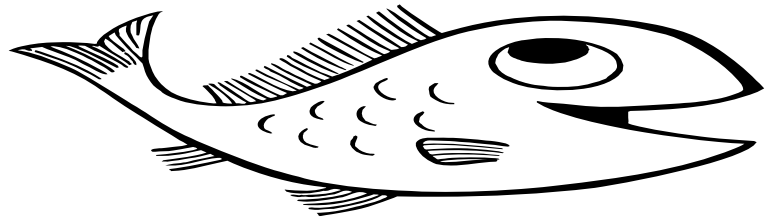

By-Laws of The Lake Alice Association

Current by-Laws for the association are located below. A copy of these by-laws along with a copy of some proposed changes will be discussed at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This organization shall be known as the LAKE ALICE ASSOCIATION INC.

ARTICLE II

OBJECTIVE: To protect, preserve, and improve the ecosystems of Lake Alice through education of and communication between concerned citizens

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: Anyone desiring to do so may be a member

ARTICLE IV

VOTING AND OFFICE HOLDING PRIVILEGES: Active members in good standing (i.e. whose dues are current) shall have the right to vote. Each property or residence shall have one vote.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS: The Board of Directors shall consist of six (6) individuals elected by the membership.

The Board of Directors shall decide which board member shall serve as president and which as secretary/treasurer.

ARTICLE VI

TERMS OF OFFICE: The initial president and secretary/treasurer shall serve a term of one year. All subsequent elections shall be for a two year term. No term limits.

ARTICLE VII

DUTIES OF OFFICERS:

- A. The duties of the officers are such as are implied in their respective titles and which usually pertain to their respective offices, and other duties that may from time to time be delegated to them by the membership or the Board of Directors.

- B. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Association and shall appoint all committees.
- C. The Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in the President's absence.
- D. The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings at Association meetings and at Board of Directors meetings, and shall conduct all correspondence.
- E. The Treasurer shall collect all dues, receive all monies due from other sources, keep a record of all receipts and disbursements and keep an accurate record of current membership and "Friends" status.
- F. The Directors shall perform duties as assigned by the President.
- G. The Board of Directors shall conduct the business of the Association and have the same rights, privileges, and duties as are generally conferred upon Boards of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII

NOMINATION AND ELECTIONS:

- A. A nomination committee, consisting of three members, shall be appointed by the President. The Committee's duty shall be to present for the annual meeting at which elections are held a slate of Officers and Director candidates. They shall contact all proposed candidates and must obtain their consent.
- B. The election of Officers and Directors must take place at the annual meeting, of each year, at which time further nominations may be made from the floor.
- C. In the event that further nominations are made from the floor, election of Directors shall be by ballot.
- D. Officers and Directors shall be elected by votes cast by members present, and candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected.
- E. In event a vacancy should occur on the Board of Directors, the Board may exercise its discretion in filling the vacancy by interim appointment from among the Association membership after obtaining the consent of the prospective appointee.

ARTICLE IX

STANDING COMMITTEES: The President may appoint the following Standing Committees:

- 1. Membership and Publicity Committee
 - 2. Entertainment Committee
 - 3. Lake Fish Stocking Committee
- B. In addition, the President may at any time appoint special committees should the need arise.

ARTICLE X

DUTIES OF COMMITTEES:

- A. The Membership and Publicity Committee shall be responsible for recruiting new members and promoting enthusiasm in the Association to maintain membership. It shall promote and be responsible for publicity and news releases for the Association and its activities.
- B. The Entertainment Committee shall provide for entertainment and social affairs for the Association. Should there be any expense involved, it should be sanctioned by the Board of Directors.

- C. The Lake Fish Stocking Committee shall be responsible for conducting stocking programs as appropriate, work with the Department of Natural Resources in determining the most effective plan.

ARTICLE XI

AMENDMENTS:

This constitution may be amended, modified, or changed by a two-thirds vote of all members present at any regular business meeting, provided that notice of the proposed change has been presented in a previous meeting and announced by mail to all members at least one week previous to the meeting at which such change is to be voted on.

ARTICLE XII

DISSOLUTION:

This Association shall not be dissolved as long as ten members desire its continuance. In the event of dissolution, all properties and funds over and above that which is necessary to meet any and all outstanding liabilities incurred by the Association shall be turned over to a non-sectarian charity designated by the members.

ARTICLE XIII

RULES OF ORDER: In all matters pertaining to the conduct of business, Robert's Rules of Order shall govern.

ARTICLE XIV

MEETINGS: Except as may otherwise be designated, the two semi-annual membership meetings of the Association shall be held on the third Saturday of May and the third Saturday of September.

ARTICLE XV

SPECIAL MEETINGS: Special membership meetings may be called at the request of ten members, or upon the request of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XVI

DUES: The annual membership dues of the Association shall be \$10.00. New candidates for membership may be admitted to membership during the fiscal year, the dues for the remainder of that fiscal year to be established on a pro-rata basis by appropriate action of the Board of Directors. No dues will be refundable except by unanimous action of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XVII

QUORUM: Ten members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE XVIII

FISCAL YEAR: The fiscal year shall be from June 1 to May 31

ARTICLE XIX

RESIGNATIONS: Any member may resign from the Association upon presenting his or her resignation personally or in writing to the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XX

TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP: The applicable membership of any member may be terminated at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

New regulation changes game fishing on Wisconsin River between Rhinelander and Kings Dam (reprinted from the Wisconsin DNR website)

RHINELANDER - A 22-mile stretch of the Wisconsin River from Rhinelander to Kings Dam will now be closed to game fish angling starting April 1, 2009 and reopen with the statewide opener on May 2. That section of the river -- which had been open in the past to fishing year 'round -- is being closed to protect spawning game fish.

"This part of the river was once one of the most polluted in the state," said Fisheries Manager Dave Seibel, "and closed seasons were not needed to protect fish that people did not want and weren't plentiful. Since the passage of laws like the Clean Water Act in 1972 and other regulations, however, the river has made a dramatic comeback and the abundance of bass and walleye have increased along with fishing pressure."

The regulation change now makes the section of the river consistent with most inland waters in northern Wisconsin. After April 1 and in the future, game fishing on the river will open the first Saturday in May and run through the first Sunday in March. Also applicable this year and in the future is a catch and release only season on bass from the first Saturday in May through the Friday before the third Saturday in June. After that the daily bag limit is five with a minimum of 14 inches.

The river portion included in the change begins at the Rhinelander Paper Mill (St. Regis) Dam down river to Kings Dam including Hat Rapids Flowage and Lake Alice.

**WDNR Lake Planning Grant Proposal
Large-Scale Project
Lake Alice Stewardship Program:
Phase I – Baseline Information Gathering
and Adaptive Lake Management Plan**

INTRODUCTION

This proposal seeks a large-scale lake management planning grant from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) Lake Planning Grants program. Our vision is to ensure the perpetuation of a healthy Lake Alice and its surrounding landscape far into the future. We believe that the tool by which to realize this vision is an adaptive management plan for the Lake Alice watershed. We conceive of a several year program, composed of annual phases that progress toward the overall vision. In the first phase proposed herein, we plan to gather and review relevant information and begin the development of an adaptive lake management plan for Lake Alice. This is the first large-scale project that addresses the long-term health of Lake Alice. The proposal is presented by the Lake Alice Association (LAA) with technical assistance by White Water Associates, Inc. We adopt the concept of “adaptive management” in our approach to the Lake Alice Stewardship Program. Simply stated, adaptive management uses findings from planned monitoring activities to inform future management actions and periodic refinement of the plan. An adaptive management plan accommodates new findings by integrating this information into successive iterations of the comprehensive plan. The plan will therefore be a dynamic entity, successively evolving and improving to fit the needs of Lake Alice and its watershed. Adaptive management admits to our uncertain knowledge about natural ecosystems and allows us to adjust the plan to changing conditions and new information. Monitoring the outcomes of plan implementation is absolutely essential to the process of adaptive management. We think that monitoring should focus on specific indicators designed to measure the progress toward program goals.

Besides this introduction section, we organize this proposal around the topics outlined in the WDNR Lake Management Grant Application including (1) Project Area, (2) Problem Statement, (3) Project Goals and Objectives, (4) Methods and Activities, (5) Project Products, (6) Data to be Collected, (7) Existing and Proposed Partnerships, (8) Role of Project in Planning and/or Management of Lake, (9) Timetable for Implementation of Key Activities, (10) Plan for Sharing Project Results, (11) Budget for Phase I, and (12) Supplemental Information in Support of Project

PROJECT AREA

The proposed project views Lake Alice as part of a larger landscape ecosystem (for purposes of this program, the Lake Alice Watershed). Since Lake Alice is a part of the Wisconsin River system, its overall watershed is enormous. Lake Alice also has its own smaller surrounding watershed. The lake is affected by the watershed and the watershed is influenced by the lake in an integrated ecological system. Although Phase I of the program will focus on Lake Alice itself and the associated riparian ecosystem, future phases will address others aspects of the watershed as part of an integrated and adaptive management system. In this section, we briefly describe Lake Alice and its surroundings.

Lake Alice is a 1,369 lake on the Wisconsin River. It is in the Upper Wisconsin River Watershed and located near the town of Tomahawk in Lincoln County, Wisconsin. Despite its large surface area, Lake Alice is a fairly shallow lake and has a maximum depth of about 32 feet. It has a tremendous diversity of aquatic

habitats. Lake Alice can be best described as an “impoundment” in the Wisconsin River as its water level is controlled by King’s Dam (operated by the Wisconsin Valley Improvement Company). The map at the bottom of this page highlights major features of Lake Alice. There are two official public access sites on Lake Alice and a portage around King’s Dam. Lake Alice is an important resource used by the public for a diversity of recreational pursuits.

Minutes from the 2008 Annual Meeting
Lake Alice Association 2008 Annual meeting

June 21st 11:00 a.m. at Surewood Forest

The annual meeting was called to order by President Glenn Mott.

33 members were in attendance.

Old Business:

-The minutes for the 2007 Annual meeting were handed out.

-Bruce Oradei gave a recap on Invasive Species. We missed out on a grant by 1 point. They went to training in Minocqua.

-Mike Sigl and Neil Pietenpol gave an update on the proposal for changing the rule for open fishing from Regis Dam to Kings Dam.

The rule change has passed the state vote and the conservation congress vote. Several members will be attending the Natural Resources board meeting in Waupaca on June 25th. At this point we are the only 2 registered speakers on this topic (so that means no one will be speaking against it). Once this passes the Natural Resources board the final step is approval by the state. The state has always followed the recommendation of the Natural Resources Board.

Neil reported pushing for slot limits, but was shot down in Madison. They will be doing a survey of Lake Alice in the next 1-2 years. If we qualify they will review it.

-Mike Sigl gave an update on Krull Island. Mr. Krull has passed away and his daughter has the information about purchasing the island. At this time the family has no interest in selling the property.

-Glenn Mott gave an update on the Condo development. Currently the Condo development has been abandoned and the land has returned to farm land. However it has been newly listed at \$825,000. If the property would sell it would have to comply with the new zoning rules if it were to be developed. Bruce stated that the town board is watching this closely.

-Financial Report: 2008 Alice in Winterland information was handed out and reviewed. It was noted that the fish registration was up \$600. Profit was up \$2100 from last year (cold freezing cold) but only up \$300 from 2 years ago.

We will be needing money for invasive species and hopefully the Island.

The board has decided not to have a late summer party to do lack of participation last year.

Mike Sigl made a motion to approve the minutes from the 2007 annual meeting and Phil Zipp 2nd the motion. The motion carried.

New Business:

Election of board members:

Phil Zipp nominated Neil Pietenpol, Glenn Mott and Hank and Andrea Michaud.

Neil Pietenpol nominated Dave and Linda Barrows.

Phil Zipp made a motion to close nominations, Mike Sigl 2nd the motion.

Phil Zipp made a motion to make a unanimous vote for the nominated members. Mike Sigl 2nd the motion. The motion carried.

It was decided to stagger the terms so only 1/3 of the board would be up for election on any given year.

Recruit new members:

The board is looking for suggestions to recruit new members. Also perhaps volunteers to do a membership drive. It was suggested to get newsletters to the Lake Alice resorts and have them keep them in their rooms. The current membership list will be posted in the next newsletter so that everyone can see if their neighbors are members and if not try to recruit them.

Financials:

The question was raised as to why the amount deposited from Alice in Winterland does not match the amount of profit listed on the Alice in Winterland summary sheet. This will be looked into.

Raffle tickets:

Tickets have been printed and will be sent to members to sell or can be obtained from any board member. The tickets will be 3/\$10 or \$5 each. It will be a cash raffle. First prize will be \$1000, second prize \$500 and third prize \$250. We are able to sell tickets 9 months in advance of the drawing.
